Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in NAPLAN tests for reading, writing, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

Making sure students have computer skills is part of our school curriculum, and our teachers will ensure your child is familiar with the online format. 













