Compulsory School Attendance

Did you know that if a student misses as little as eight days in a school term, by the end of primary school they will have missed over a year of education?

In NSW, all children from six years of age are legally required to attend school.

Children are expected to attend all school activities, on time. Regular attendance helps your child:

- develop the skills needed to access the world of work and other opportunities
- to learn the importance of punctuality and routine
- make and keep friendships.

If your child has to be absent from school, you must tell the school and provide a reason for your child's absence. To explain an absence parents are required to:

- send a note to the school
- telephone the school or
- visit the school.



Principals help to ensure the safety, welfare and wellbeing of your child. Principals have to keep accurate records of student attendance and the reasons for any absences. Principals may request further information from parents for long or frequent absences, even where they are explained by parents as being due to illness.

When absences are unexplained by parents, or the explanations are not accepted by the principal, the school will work with parents to help address the issue. The main aim is to sort out what is preventing the child from getting to school and putting strategies in place to help,

Anaphylaxis information
