#### **2014 KINDERGARTEN ENROLMENTS**

We are now taking registrations for Kindergarten students who will start school in 2014. Any families who have a child starting Kindergarten in 2014 are asked to contact the School Office on 4930 4210, or come to the office during school hours to register their child for Kindergarten 2014.

A letter detailing Kindergarten Orientation details will be sent home to all registered families during Term 3. Parents will need to ensure they have returned the enrolment form and their child's birth certificate, immunisation certificate and proof of address before Kindergarten Orientation.

#### **PARENT HELPER/VISITOR ATTENDANCE**

In keeping with the Department of Educations Work, Health and Safety requirements, we ask that any parent/visitor attending our school during school hours signs our Parent Helper/Visitor Attendance book at the front office. On arrival parents/visitors will be given a "Visitors" badge to be worn during their stay and asked to return the badge an sign out on their departure.

#### **EARLY ARRIVALS**

It has been noted by staff that the number of students arriving at our school before 8:45am has grown. Please be advised that students are not supervised by staff until school grounds open at 8:45am. Staff are concerned about student safety at this time, and encouraged parents and carers to be fully aware that staff supervision commences at 8:45am and that students arriving prior to this time need to be supervised by a parent/ carer until staff arrive on duty. Please be aware that If your child arrives at school <u>before</u> 8:45am you will need to sign your child in at the front office.

#### GATE ENTRY THROUGHOUT THE SCHOOL DAY

We would like to remind parents that only one school entry and exit gate located near the front office will be unlocked between the hours of 8:45m and 3pm. Parents/Visitors are asked to close this gate behind them.
