#### WHITE RIBBON DAY

We were very fortunate to have Mr Jon Chin, White Ribbon Ambassador, speak to our school community today and his message was very clear. Violence should never be tolerated in our society, and we should never be silent when we know that someone is a victim of violence. As parents and educators of young children we have a role to play in putting an end to domestic violence. Let's work together to create a society where boys and girls are valued equally and there are no expectations on us because of our gender. Let's teach our children to value everything about themselves that is special and unique, and to offer that same respect to others.

All books are now to be returned to the library for stocktaking. Reminders were sent home at the end of Week 7 and a number of students have already returned their books. Another reminder will be sent at the end of this week. If you child has a reminder note please encourage them to return their books as soon as possible. If your child is unable to locate the books please help by checking in your own bookshelves as they can often be misplaced, or encouraging a clean-up of the bedroom, as books sometimes find their ways into rather unusual places. After searching for books and if they are still unable to be found please either pay the cost on the reminder notice or come and talk to me about your situation.

Over the last few weeks of school I will be running a competition to design a library bag. Templates will be available in the library and students are encouraged to think about what the library and books means to them when creating their designs. Two designs will be selected – one from infants and one from primary – to be printed onto library bags that will be available for purchase next year. There will be a 50cent cost to submit a design, with the money used to obtain printing materials. Students who create the winning design will receive a library bag and certificate.

#### **STAGE ONE EXCURSION TO WOOLWORTHS**

On Wednesday 4th November, students in 1T, 1-2J and 2H went on an excursion to Woolworths at Cessnock as part of their Science and Technology unit 'From Paddock to Plate'. Whilst there the students got to learn about the role of the baker and how the bread is produced. They got to watch how the butcher makes mince and then how it is packaged ready for sale. Students also got to see what is behind the big clear plastic doors and on our way in we heard "I have always wanted to go through these doors." Once there they saw the loading docks, a lot of long life produce and how the fruit and vegetables are prepared for selling. Students asked the staff at Woolworths some very interesting questions that enhanced their learning experience and got to enjoy some tasty treats. All of the Stage 1 teachers were very proud of the student's behaviour and impeccable manners. We would also like to thank all of the wonderful parents who came along to support staff and students throughout the excursion.
