

I have set a goal of 95% attendance, this would allow 1 day a term away from school with justification. The best opportunity for students to learn is to be at school.


DISCOVER UNI DAY

PBL - SLIGHT CHANGES TO REWARD SYSTEM

At the beginning of Term 2, a change to the token reward system was introduced to the students. The following summary outlines how the system works. Could you please go through these procedures with your child.



- Students collect Seeking Success tokens for upholding Abermain Public Schools PBL expectations
- Students continue to cut the top (smaller section) off their Seeking Success cards/tokens and place them in their classroom box. This remains the same process as we have used in the past, the only difference is that these will now be collected at the end of every term for the major PBL draw instead of weekly. Our new token exchange system will replace these weekly draws.
- Students have been given a copy of their reward card.
- Once students have saved up their desired number of tokens they can then exchange them for the reward of their choice.
- Each term in Week 4, during the PBL lesson, students will be given the opportunity to inform the teacher of the reward they would like to exchange for. At this point, the teacher will take the necessary amount of tokens and mark on the student's card the reward they have chosen.
- Students take their reward card home to inform parents of the student's reward for positive behaviour and also allows them to assist in preparing for the rewards day (this will only be necessary in some instances, for example, parents will need to be aware if students have chosen to be out of uniform for the day). Please ensure the date of the rewards day (ie Wednesday Week 5 or 10) is on the card when it is sent home.
- On the Wednesday of Week 5 and 10 students will receive their reward. So, if they choOse to be out of
 uniform this will be the day they come out of uniform. If they chose a lucky dip then this will be the day
 they receive their lucky dip. If they chose a merit card, then this will be the day they receive their merit
 card etc...
- Once students have used their reward card and made an exchange they will be given a new reward card so they can work towards saving for their next reward.

Please note:

- Students can only collect 1 reward on each exchange day, i.e. if they have 50 tokens they may not exchange for something to the value of 20 tokens and something to the value of 30 tokens.
- Students may choose not to exchange on every rewards day. This is fine.
- Merit cards can still be collected outside the token exchange system. Students can exchange 25 Seeking Successes for a merit card at any time, or whenever the teacher feels that a child is deserving of one.
