
INTRODUCTION OF SMS NOTIFICATION OF STUDENT ABSENCES

In Term 2, 2016 Abermain Public School will commence using a Short Messaging Service (SMS) called SMS Absence alerts to send parents/carers notification of absence for their children on a daily basis. As a parent/carer you are required to send your child to school everyday unless you have provided a reason for them to be away.

Class rolls will be marked by teachers at the start of the school day. A list of absences is then generated and will be used to automatically send a SMS early in the day to a parent/carer of each child on the list, alerting them to the fact that their child is currently marked absent from school. Parents/Carers will then be asked to respond by SMS to provide a detailed reason for the absence. Each response is then checked and determined if the absence is justified (eg sick, doctors appointment, funeral) or unjustified (eg holiday, running late, parent appointment, transport) The absence is then recorded as explained and each message attached to the students' electronic attendance file. Please note: the exact message you reply is what is recorded on the student's electronic attendance file.

Parents/Carers do NOT need to send in a note of explanation if a return text explanation is provided.

If a parent/carer believes his or her child is at school he/she can telephone the school at which point staff will endeavour to confirm the students' attendance at school, and then communicate this to the parent/carer and, as necessary adjust school records, or refer the matter to the relevant class teacher for follow up.





It is essential that the mobile phone numbers which we have recorded are accurate. Please ensure that you notify us of any changes to your phone number by contacting the school on 4930 4210 or sending an email to the school - abermain-p.school@det.nsw.edu.au

The Sentral SMS notification system uses the mobile phone number of the primary carer. If you would like a different mobile number to be used, please contact the school.

LIBRARY

Thank you to all the families that support Book Club within our school. When returning your slip to school please ensure your child's name is clearly marked and that it is clear which items are to be ordered. If you require additional forms either ask at the office or see Miss Craig.


