As part of the commitment to better support the needs of students with disability, all Australian governments have collaborated to implement improvements to data collections to ensure a stronger evidence base from which policy and programs can be developed. The Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (the national data collection) represents a major achievement and a highpoint of these efforts. Through the national data collection, schools and governments are reporting for the first time in a nationally consistent way on the number of students with disability and the educational adjustments they receive

We ended the day with a Closing Ceremony in our school hall with parents/carers and community members present. Claire C opened the ceremony with an Acknowledgement of Country and explained the theme and significance of NAIDOC Week. Our Cultural Dance group performed several dances with the guidance of Joey Griffiths. Abermain Public School also had two students, Jorja L and Michael E along with Mrs McGee, attend the NAIDOC Assembly at Cessnock High School where they witnessed a smoking ceremony and spoke at the assembly about the meaning of the new goanna emblem created by Cessnock High School in collaboration with our local AECG members.
