PRINCIPAL'S NEWS

This week I was reading an interesting article that I would like to share:

"When parents engage with their child's school, it creates a successful partnership with great results for students, schools and parents. Research has shown the benefits of parental engagement in children's education include, among others, better academic outcomes and fewer behavioural issues, so we all have a stake in making sure we get it right. As ever, the key to it all is communication.

Parental engagement refers to the broader role parents play in supporting their child's learning. While children are younger and in a preschool setting, parental involvement tends to consist of activities like parents helping with story time or excursions and face-to-face chats with the educators at drop off and pick up. However, once children start primary school, research has shown a reduction in this type of direct involvement in classroom activities and committees.

As children make their way through school, the nature of parental engagement changes. Research found that parental engagement is most effective when it is focused on developing positive attitudes towards learning and education for children, building their motivation and confidence as learners and fostering their enjoyment of learning. Schools can help parents to do this by communicating clearly and often.

Having the capacity to communicate directly with school allows parents to show support in a meaningful way that positively impacts on their child's future and utilising a streamlined system of communication can restore 'information sanity' to even the busiest of parents.

How does your school use technology to involve parents?"

Abermain Public School has many forms of communication where parents are be able to seek information about their children and what is happening at school: Class Dojo, School App, Facebook, Newsletters, email the school, phone calls, meeting the teacher face-to-face and notes. Through the open communication and support at school and home we can provide positive learning opportunities for all the students. Please don't hesitate to contact the school if you have any questions.

I would also like to clarify the end of school day procedures for parents and family collecting students at the end of the day.

Parents/carers are welcome to come into the school, when gates open at 3.00pm, to wait near the Lunch Sheds at the Parent Pick Up Point. A bell rings at 3:10pm for the teachers and first bus students only. Teachers will bring all students to the COLA /DOTS area and line up at the appropriate exit point prior to 3:15pm. At 3:15pm the end of the day bell will ring. Students will be walked to the gates or can be collected at that time from Parent Pick Up.

If parents/carers are collecting their students prior to 3:15pm you will need to report to the office, sign your children out and have your children called to the office by staff. We ask that students and parents wait until the teachers dismiss the children before leaving the school premises. We follow these procedures to ensure a safe exit at the end of the day.

Starting Monday 26th February, 2018 the new gate at the corner of the soccer fields will be open for parents/carers and students to enter and exit the school between 8.45am-9.15am and 3.00pm and 3.15pm . Please have a conversation with your child/children if you wish them to start using this gate on Monday. A staff member will take the students to the bottom field gate.

Seven new school zone traffic offences

To help schools keep the school zone safer for all pedestrians and drivers there are seven new traffic infringements with new fines.

None of the seven offences attract demerit points when committed elsewhere on the road but in a school zone they each come with two points.

The changes are:

- 1. Stopping in intersection Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a penalty of \$439 and 2 demerit points.
- 2. Stop within 20m of intersection (traffic lights) Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a penalty of \$439 and 2 demerit points.
- 3. Stop within 10m of intersection (no traffic lights) Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a penalty of \$439 and 2 demerit points.
- 4. Stop near bicycle crossing lights Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a penalty of \$439 and 2 demerit points.
- 5. Obstruct access to ramp/path/passageway Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a penalty of \$330 and 2 demerit points.
- 6. Not parallel park in the direction of travel Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a \$330 fine and 2 demerit points.
- 7. Parallel park close to dividing line Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a \$330 fine and 2 demerit points.






