Last month Michelle Robards and Shannon Wade attended a Canteen Supervisor Meeting to be introduced to the new regulations for our canteen that will commence in 2019. Currently our school is operating with 73% of our school items acceptable by the Health Department. In 2019 the requirement for school canteens in NSW will be 75%. Congratulations to our canteen helpers who are so close to the goal already. There will be a few changes made in 2019 to accommodate the required healthy benchmark. Changes will include introducing the new fish burgers, removing chicken wedges, chocolate muffins, finger buns, lemonade and cola ice monies, as well as chicken and pizza JJ's. These few small changes will see our canteen address the healthy canteen requirements. If you have any concerns can you please contact the P&C.

Our 2018 Anti-bullying Plan has been up loaded to the school website under "new policies." This plan is driven through our PBL strategies that are implemented throughout the year. Children's University visit to the University of Newcastle

On Tuesday 3rd July, 2018 students from Abermain who are involved in the Children's University Program had a wonderful day visiting the University of Newcastle with their family members. We were invited to attend and participate in a variety of activities that taught us about some of the different things that you can learn about at University.

Our first session was in the Psychology building where one of the lecturers was teaching us about how our brains process what we see in different ways. We looked at different pictures and tried to complete a task that showed us how sometimes our brains can trick us!

Our next session was with some guys from 'Toonworld'. They taught us about drawing simple cartoons and how a pencil can be seen as a sword of destiny. A few students were involved in assisting in creating a simple stop motion film using the free app 'Stop Motion Studio.' This was a lot of fun.

During our lunch break someone from the Science department taught us about solids, liquids, and gases by demonstrating some different experiments, including some explosions. This was very engaging and entertaining!

Next we continued on to the Architecture building where students were given a small building challenge and asked a lot of questions about what it takes to be an Architect and learned how Architects work with Engineers. We also were able to view a variety of models made by architecture students – these were really cool!



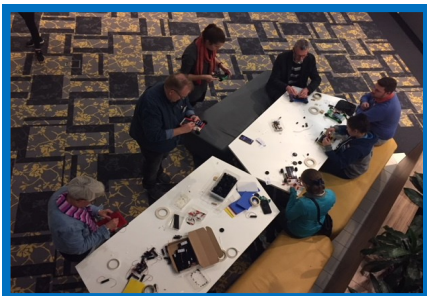


Children's University visit to the University of Newcastle cont'd

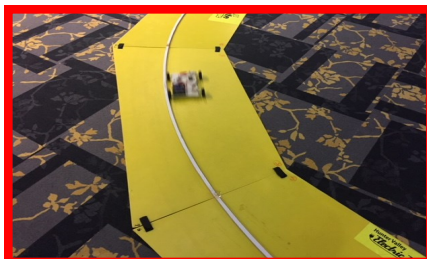

It was a wonderful day for everyone who attended and Abermain students should be very proud of their wonderful and respectful behaviour.



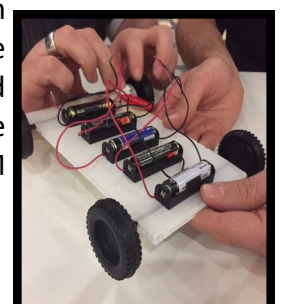
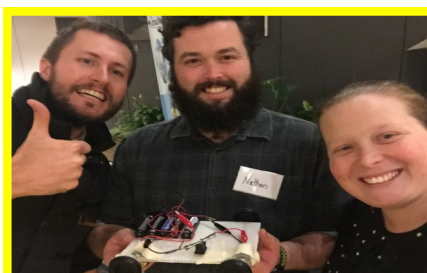
Stage 3 Teachers Electric Vehicle Training

In Week 8, Mr Checkley, Mr Power and Miss Schroder went to the University of Newcastle after school one day to learn how to make simple electric vehicles. This was a fun evening where we got to have a hands-on turn at building, testing and rebuilding electric vehicles to try and make one that stayed on the track and went really quickly.



Mr Power and Mr Checkley were very keen to make a design that went very fast and used lots of batteries to try this! However, this created too much power for the motor to handle, so we had to make small changes and keep testing until it worked. As a team, we brainstormed ideas and solutions until we developed the fastest car made that evening.

We attended this training because next term Stage Three students will be also using the design process to develop electric vehicles and will learn about different forms of energy. We are really excited to work on this awesome STEM project next .





5/6S Snortlepig Artworks

This term 5/6S have been exploring different visual texts that explore the ways humans can impact the natural environment. After reading the story *Uno's Garden* by Graeme Base, we created these artworks on a character called a Snortlepig. At the beginning of the story you can see the Snortlepig on every page, but by the end you can't see it at all.

We created the artworks using oil pastels and worked on developing skills to blend the different colours. After completing the snortlepics together, each student created their own background using ideas from the story and their own imagination.

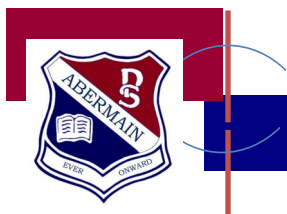
The information collected by schools for the purposes of the 2018 national data collection will ultimately be provided to the Department.

Don't even mention sparkling glitter! Billions and trillions of tonnes of glitter. Glitter is getting in to the seas and water ways and fish are eating it.

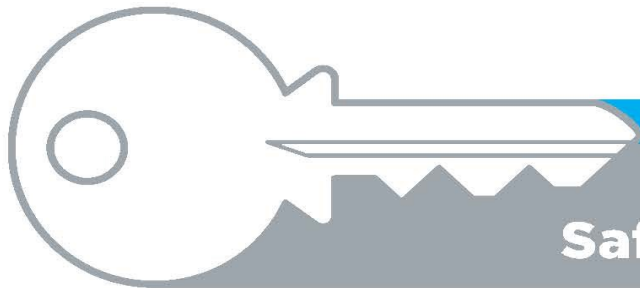

NSW POLICE FORCE CRIME PREVENTION SERIES

Safe people, Safe places

The safety and wellbeing of our children is paramount. As parents and carers we can't always be with our children to advise and protect them.

When out and about, children can be confronted with situations where good decision-making is vital. With this in mind, advising our children with appropriate responses to certain situations will help them avoid trouble and danger.

Here are some simple tips to give your children for when they are out and about.

Protect your child walking home

- **ALWAYS** identify safe places on the way home from school.
- **DO NOT** stop and talk to people you don't know. Go straight home or to your intended destination.
- **ALWAYS** find a safe place if you feel frightened. These include schools, shops, churches or police/fire/ambulance stations and tell them that you are frightened.
- **NEVER** get into a car with someone you don't know.

Protect your child on public transport

- **NEVER** travel in isolated areas. Find crowded carriages, guard's compartment (marked with a blue light) or at the front of the bus.
- **ALWAYS** try to travel in groups of friends if possible.

Protect your child when in public spaces

- **ALWAYS** carry a contact number for your parents. (On a card attached to your clothing, written on your arms or in your phone).
- **DO NOT** walk away from family or friends without telling them where you are going, when you'll be back and who you are with.
- **ALWAYS** walk away from fights or arguments, unpleasant or aggressive behaviour and take your friends with you.
- **REMEMBER**, always tell your parents, carer or teacher if something has happened.

HEAD LICE

Head lice are only found on the human head and often congregate on the crown of the head, so that is not until you reach these last sections of hair that you find adult lice. However, heads that are severely infected will have lice everywhere. Head lice do not live on furniture, hats, bedding, carpet or anywhere else in the environment. If you find any eggs or lice, please commence treatment. It is also recommended to repeat treatment every 5-6 days for the next couple of weeks to ensure all eggs have been removed.

Report Illegal Dirt Bike Activity

The use of unregistered motor cycles in Cessnock area has been a long-term issue

affecting residents. Police are now targeting illegal motor cycle use with the introduction of Operation RIDA - Report Illegal Dirt Bike Activity.

Police often receive calls regarding unregistered motor cycles however by the time police arrive the bikes and riders are gone. As part of Operation RIDA police are asking members of the community to be their eyes and ears in relation to this issue.

Police need your help and are asking members of the community to notify police about these riders and where they live. There are members of the community who are being forced to endure the ordeal of having neighbours that come and go at all hours of the day and night on these unregistered motor cycles - it has to stop.

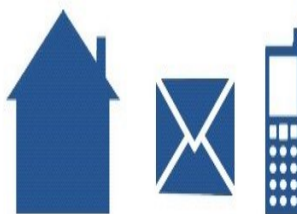
