Mr Bridge is in the process of conducting school trials for boys and girls football to select a few students to attend the Zone Football Trials in a few weeks.

















YEAR 6 POLO SHIRTS

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

This year our school has been selected by the Department of Education to participate in an 'External Validation' process. This process is designed to ensure that schools successfully implement and evaluate their School Plan and is an opportunity to share our success stories with an independent panel.

Our students have excelled on the sporting field and in the pool over the last two weeks. INSTRUCTIONAL LEADER NEWS

At our last assembly 28 Stage 1 students were celebrated for their hard work they have done to reach a level 18 in reading. Those students were applauded as our first "Beyond Reading Club" inductees!

As members of the "Beyond Reading Club", these students have learned how to read; they are now *reading to learn*. The significance of being able to read for meaning, to pull texts apart and reconstruct meaning is critical for the future of all our students and as such, we are highly committed to supporting their skill development in this area.

Congratulations to all of these amazing students, and also, big congratulations to all of their families who have undoubtedly supported them in being the readers they are today. We wish you all the very best in their next phase of learning.

School Readiness

Do you have a little person coming to school next year? Lots of families are starting think about how they can best support their little ones as they get ready for Kindergarten. Here are our top tips:

1. Spend time talking with your child

Put the phone down! Kids need to see how your moves when you make sounds so that they can learn how to make sounds correctly.

Talking with your child about things you enjoy, places you visit and things that they are wondering about helps them to learn about taking turns in conversation, expressing their ideas, how to use language in different ways and so much more. Talking helps kids process their ideas about the world around them and it is one of the best things to support school readiness.

2. Count everything and look for patterns everywhere

Kids need to be able to use the 1 to 1 principle for counting as well as reading. Every time you count out loud with small children you are teaching this very important skill. Count steps as you climb them, count buttons as you do them up and count the plates on the dinner table. Such a small thing can support huge learning into the future!

Teaching kids to notice what's around them and question things is really important also. Show them how you notice the big bowl of strawberries compared to the small bowl of strawberries, how theirs has more and yours has less. Show them how to recognise quantities quickly by playing games with number symbols like cards, dominoes and dice games where they become familiar with number patterns. This is the beginning of number sense and kids who have good number sense do better in school.

3. Get reading

The more you read with your child the happier they will be! Reading with your child for just ten minutes per day will put them on the road to great reading and writing skills. kids need to hear beautiful language written in lots of different ways - this is how they hear sounds in words, develop a broad vocabulary and learn about big ideas. Share a story together to relax or have a laugh. Encourage your child to predict what might happen in a story or tell you about their favourite part. While you are reading use the words "I wonder..." (just like they do on Play School).

Kids who are read to regularly learn how to sit and listen. This is a big part of school readiness and will support their learning immeasurably.

Often students/families are referred to the Abermain Learning Support Team. We thought we would share with both new and existing families what the Learning Support Team (LST) does at Abermain Public School and who you can contact if you would like some support.

What is the learning and support team?

The LST is a group of staff members who support the learning and wellbeing of students across the school. We:

- Assist in identifying students needing difference supports to their learning and wellbeing
- ♦ Liaise with teachers to provide Best Practice supports in the classroom
- Meet with the School Counsellor on a weekly basis to provide support for students who are referred to LST
- Provide support to families to access agencies outside of school
- Implement small group and individual learning programs



Teaching behavioural expectations both at home and school is invaluable. Through the use of our PBL processes and the use of our PAWs Contracts, we are able to guide and encourage students to grow into young people who have a positive influence on those around them.

We hope that you have had the opportunity to discuss the PAWs Contract with your child and we look forward to working with you to assist your child in their journey towards pinning on their shiny badge throughout the year.

We know our community highly values the PAWs Badge and we agree that the achievement of this badge is a highly significant student achievement. We love discussing student progress with their parents/carers and we encourage all parents/carers to make an appointment to see their child's classroom teacher at the end of each term during the parent teacher interviews. VOLUNTEERS

PARENT PICK UP POINTS

A reminder to all parents/carers to wait on the DOTS area to pick their children up from the "Parent Pick Up Point" at the end of the school day. We ask parents/carers to please not wait outside classrooms and to only come through the front office entry if you are signing your child out early.

STUDENT ABSENCES

SMS texts will be sent between 9.45am and 10.00am each day to inform that an absence has been recorded for their child. Parents/carers can explain the absence either by SMS text, in person, by phone, school email or a letter to the class teacher. <u>ALL absences must</u> be explained within seven (7) school days.

If you are having attendance issues with your child, please contact the school so we can work together to improve their attendance at school.

MEDICATIONS

If your child requires non-prescribed or intermittent medication administered at school parents/carers must complete a medication form which can be obtained from the school office. This form requires specific details of medication and health management.

FOR THE SAFETY OF ALL CHILDREN MEDICATIONS MUST BE HANDED TO THE OFFICE BY PARENTS/CARERS. MEDICATIONS ARE <u>NOT</u> TO BE HANDED TO THE STUDENT TO BRING TO OR FROM SCHOOL.

EARLY LEAVERS

Parents/Carers are reminded to visit the school office if they want to sign their children out early before the end of the school day. Office staff will then contact the relevant class to request students to come up to the office. Parents/Carers are encouraged to advise their child's teacher or the office staff at the start of the school day if they require their child to be picked up at a particular time so that the student can be reminded to come up to the office at that time. To avoid delays, parents/carers are asked not to come during lunch and recess as they will be asked to wait until students return to class.

Please note: only parents/carers and those listed on the emergency contact list will be allowed to collect students early. If you would like someone who is not listed as your child's emergency contact to collect your child, please contact the school to advise the name of this person.
