This year our traditional Year 6 'Fun Day' activities will look a little different because of the Covid guidelines that are still in place.

Year 6 students still have the opportunity to organise an event to raise money for their Year 6 gift to the school, but instead of playground activities, their events will be run in classrooms!

Each class has been allocated a small team of Year 6 students who are running a class-based colouring competition and a lolly jar guessing competition, both of which will be available in classes throughout Week 9.

Details:

- When: both competitions will begin on <u>Monday 7th December</u> and be judged on Friday 11th December (Week 9).
- Price: 50c to enter the colouring competition and 50c per guess of the lolly jar (students may guess as many times as they like).
- The winning student from each classroom who guesses the closest amount of lollies will win the lolly jar, and there will be a winner and a runner up of the colouring competition, the prizes are a canteen voucher for 1st place and a chocolate bar for the runner up.

### Week 8 - Term 4, 2020



During Term 4, Kindergarten and Stage 3 classes have been working with their teachers and myself to incorporate STEM activities in the classroom. Students completed a series of mini STEM Design Thinking lessons and challenges. Using STEM based technology enabled these activities to be highly engaging for all students.

Kindergarten were introduced to the innovative Bluetooth robot named Blue Bot. Blue Bot can be used as a floor robot or controlled using an iPad. Using Blue Bot allowed Kindergarten to consolidate key mathematical skills and explore the wonders of coding by creating their own programs for Blue Bot to complete. Blue Bot was programmed to follow a set of instructions to get from one destination to another and students wrote about and illustrated their journeys. Kindergarten learnt how to create, follow and record algorithms using a series of picture cards and the Blue Bot app on the iPad. During the last lesson with Blue Bot, Kindergarten students worked in small groups to create their own map of a zoo for Blue Bot to explore. Kindergarten enjoyed making their animal coverings for Blue Bot to wear during his time exploring their group's zoo maps. Well done Kindergarten teachers and students. It was so great to see everyone enjoying learning in a new and exciting way.

In Stage 3, I worked alongside teachers to introduce mini STEM challenges to each class. These challenges were based on using the Design Thinking process and understanding how this process can be used to solve a specific problem. The activities assisted students with improving their STEM skills, with particular focus on collaboration and inquiry based learning skills. These challenges engaged all learners in the class and provided creative ways for students to demonstrate what they had learnt in class.

Stage 3 students also explored the exciting world of Tinkercad, a 3D computer design program. Students in all classes demonstrated incredible talent with their 3D designs. I look forward to seeing these skills improve further with lots of practice in designing 3D models.

Thankyou to all staff and students in each of the classes I worked with during Term 4. I was so impressed by your enthusiasm to try new things and I'm looking forward to working with Abermain Public School again next year.

We are writing to advise you that we have recently had several cases of nits/head lice in the hair of some students within the school.

Could you please check your child/children's hair for nits and lice tonight. Head lice are only found on the human head and often congregate on the crown of the head, so that is not until you reach these last sections of hair that you find adult lice. However, heads that are severely infected will have lice everywhere. Head lice do not live on furniture, hats, bedding, carpet or anywhere else in the environment. If you find any eggs or lice, please commence treatment. It is also recommended to repeat treatment every 5-6 days for the next couple of weeks to ensure all eggs have been removed.
